

History

The Limes Farm County Primary School was opened in 1969 taking in both Infant and Junior children from Limes Farm and the surrounding area. It stands in attractive grounds in the centre of an open area of the Limes Farm Estate. Accessibility to London and the surrounding Essex countryside (including Epping and Hainault Forests) provide a wealth of resources for study through first-hand experience.

Limes Farm County Infant School was opened in 1974 which left the original building for Juniors only.

The school has eight well-furnished teaching areas which are built in four pairs with a partition between them. In addition, there are two rooms and an atrium which are used for intervention support. The atrium is a particularly attractive feature of the building.

There is a spacious assembly hall which is equipped for Physical Education and is also used as a dining area.

The playground is open to the Community during the evenings and weekends and the school has joint use with the Community of the local playing area in front of the school and the nearby football pitch. A range of sporting activities are organised on the playground, such as football, tennis, basketball and cricket for children to take part in and enjoy at playtime.

There are also creative play options for pupils, which include: music, theatre, drawing, gardening and perseverance and stamina training.

Within our school grounds, a very successful teacher training facility is also based. Strong collaborative links are made. Limes Farm Infant School is next to the Junior School where effective systems are in place to ensure a smooth transition is in place.
